EPRP teaches its members to stand up for their beliefs and values. EPRP's shared goals are to exercise the right to practice to change the government through peaceful and democratic means. Peaceful and democratic were and are unacceptable to the people in power.

On the contrary, the opponents and the enemies of EPRP label the party as militarist/anarchist and undemocratic, YE'MYEN EKEK WEDE ABYE L'KK.

In order to test whether, EPRP was or is undemocratic, I ask readers to carefully understand the following events in the life of EPRP.

ANJA: When the majority of the CC of the party made the decision concerning the form of leadership, two individuals, by the name of Berhane Meskel Redda and Getachew Maru have attempted to abort the decision using their Celebes names to discontinue the operation of EPRP's programs.
