

Unidentified Human Remains

The BC Coroners Service and Prince George RCMP request the public's assistance in identifying this male whose remains were discovered November 2010 in a wooded area south of Tyner Boulevard in Prince George. He is thought to have died some weeks before his discovery.

He is thought to be of north-east African descent, perhaps Somalian, Eritrean, or Ethiopian. He is likely a young adult, approximately 20 – 30 years old; 5'6" to 5'10" tall; and has a slim build. There was a Prince George transit map and timetable in his possession, leading investigators to consider the possibility that he may not be a local citizen.

At the time of his death he was wearing size 32/32 blue jeans; size 10 shoes; a brown long-sleeve t-shirt with a Corona beer logo; black hoodie; blue-tinted wrap-around sunglasses; and a red and white ski jacket. He was in possession of a bluish grey backpack with a Calgary radio station logo.
